

### Mater Christi Region - England Christmas Blessings



Mother General cordially invited the sisters of the Sacred Heart Province, Italy, to celebrate the annual Community Day that is sponsored by the General Council on Saturday, November 18, 2023, at Via Trevignano Romano.

The participation of the Sisters who came from the various houses was numerous and very lively, an army of bold soldiers, no longer very young, but still full of enthusiasm and excited to be together again.

Mother General, Sister Ascenza Tizzano, with the General Council delightfully and diligently prepared the meeting. With the presence of the Provincial Superior, Sister Virginia Iamele, her Council, and the sisters, it was a day filled with emotion, surprises, and profound interest and pride. The presence of Don Marco Del Canuto, pastor of Santa Margherita Cathedral of Montefiascone, made everything more solemn and full of meaning.



The day was marked by moments of prayer and reflection, animated by Don Marco and the General Council, interrupted by breaks where the sisters not only enjoyed the snacks prepared by the host community of Via



Trevignano Romano, but it was their opportunity and joy to interact with each other. The main feature of the day was viewing the new documentary "The Light Still Shines." Part One of the documentary richly explains and illustrates the life and work of our Holy Mother Foundress, Saint Lucy Filippini, with filial reference to the guidance of Venerable Cardinal Mark Antony Barbarigo. What to say? It was a time of pure enjoyment of the spirit!

Even though everyone was familiar with the various details, the documentary brought these descriptions back to life and they spoke so eloquently. The heroic deeds of the little and great Lucy were notable and filled the sisters with filial pride.



Part two of the documentary captures the beautification and canonization of Saint Lucy and briefly introduces our Mission countries. Testaments of Sisters from various parts of the world share the call of their vocation, and in what way their desire to give themselves to the Lord grew. Many confided that in their life choice, they were attracted by the Figures and Works of Saint Lucy Filippini.

Thus emerged the virtues that distinguished our Foundress:

- her firm conviction of faith and attitude of abandonment, which allowed her to overcome the numerous trials of her life:
- the spirit of sacrifice and attention towards the weakest:
- her unconditional dedication to others, from children to adults, and also to fallen women;
- filial devotion to the Virgin Mary.

The central moment of the day was the celebration of the Eucharist, presided by Don Marco. Anticipating the feast of the Presentation of the Virgin Mary in the Temple, the sisters also reaffirmed their Oblation together as a Province. In his homily, Don Marco underlined the words of Saint Augustine, sharing that Our Lady was great not so much for having been the Mother of the Savior, but for having been His Disciple...: and this is what our Foundress achieved.

The screening of the third part of the Documentary took place after the liturgy. This last showing highlighted the 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration that took place in Italy. Concluding the day, Mother General encouraged the sisters to be authentic witnesses of Lucy's sanctity by im-



itating her virtues. She stressed that we must continue to be a beacon of light just as witnessed in the film. This then assures that Saint Lucy's light will continue to shine.

### "Unless you become like Children..." - Montefiascone




In a previous visit to the school in Montefiascone, Sister Virginia shared her missionary experience in Ethiopia-Eritrea. Flavia and Giulia, two little sisters, were particularly impressed. That story, imprinted in their young minds, stimulated





them to start a generous initiative in favor of our missions, an activity that also involved their parents and grandparents, the entire family.







### Pilgrimage to Volto Santo

Once again, this year, Sister Virginia Iamele, Provincial Superior, invited the sisters of the Sacred Heart Province to gather for an overnight at the Provincial house to fulfill their desire and need to celebrate a small part of the Christmas Season together. The light schedule included spiritual enrichment that was provided by Father Bruno Sperandini, a former student of the Maestre Pie, the Liturgy of the Hours and Liturgy, and blocks of time to share, enjoy, and visit the Christmas sights at Saint Peter Square. Yes, it did include a





night of tombola and added treats

that followed! An obvious feeling of warmth emanated in this leisure setting.

In Father Bruno's morning session, he capitalized on two words, *fragility* and *vulnerability*. He offered insights into how we react to our fragility and how God reacts to this. He stressed that we study the crucifix where fragility is most notable. From this concept, Father moved for-

ward to the theme of vulnerability, brokenness, and being hurt. Again, the Christ that we follow was also vulnerable, and it was his vulnerability that saved us.

Father Bruno allowed for a long period of silence for each sister to reflect personally on the essence of being vulnerable and how this affects us individually, and if they were at the stable at Jesus' birth, which character could we most relate to, from the stance of our



vulnerability? He concluded the session by inviting the sisters to freely share their reflections. Liturgy followed and offered the occasion to further participate in the prayer and songs of this season.

This year Sister Virginia replaced the usual pilgrimage to a Marian shrine and instead planned a pilgrim-

age to Volto Santo to pray, sing together, and enjoy the company of our

Maestre who are ill. What an unforgettable gathering! Those sisters who were able came to the Chapel where together the Maestre prayed and sang before the beautiful chapel Crib. Then together, specially prepared refreshments were enjoyed by everyone, through the warm hospitality provided by Sister



Anna Macchia, local superior, and Sister Giancarla Bincoletto, assistant superior. Once

again song naturally became part of this gathering.

After this time together, the sisters freely went to visit the sisters in their rooms who were unable to join the group. The sisters do not have many opportunities to get to Volto Santo because they live so distant from one another, and rarely travel to Rome. This pilgrimage satisfied both the residents of Volto Santo and even more the sisters who visited on pilgrimage. In summary, this experience united the Province even more closely to those who are our most fragile and vulnerable members.



### Saint Lucy Province, USA November Community Day

The Sisters of Saint Lucy Province gathered in Saint Lucy Chapel on November 18, 2023, to celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Mary. The morning began with a



welcome by Sister Patricia Pompa, Provincial Superior, who reminded the Sisters: "We look to Mary's life of faith and draw inspiration from her. The witness of Mary's life readies us to give of ourselves wholeheartedly to a life of ongoing transformation."

In her announcements, Sister Patricia recalled with gratitude the celebratory events of the last several

months. The Sisters were reminded that during the height of the pandemic, the four Sisters who died, Sister Henrietta Aprile, Sister Josephine Ferrecchia, Sister Frances Stavalo and Sister Viola Alu, had gravesite burials since group gatherings were not permitted. Sister Patricia announced that on Saturday, April 6, 2024, a Memorial Mass will

be held in Saint Lucy Chapel to honor the memory of these four Sisters. The Community and family members of these sisters will be invited.



The sisters viewed an inspiring video highlighting Horatio Spafford, whose life was marked by sorrows and tragedy. He wrote the words to the song, "All Is Well With My Soul" as a result of the tragedies he endured. His 4-year-old son died of scarlet fever, and his 4 young daughters drowned at sea while traveling from the USA to Europe. We all experience life that is unpredictable and challenging, but with


trust and faith in God, we, too, can say, "All is well with my soul."






Closing remarks of gratitude and updates on the Sisters were made by Sister Patricia Pompa. The gift of this day was memorable and joy-filled!

Villa Victoria Academy celebrated 90 years of faith, academic achievement, and sisterhood during an anniversary celebration on Saturday, October 21, 2023, at the school's Ewing campus. Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., was the main celebrant for the Liturgy held in the school theater for the Religious Teachers Filippini and the extended Villa Victoria school community.

Following the Mass, Sister Patricia Pompa, Provincial Superior, addressed those in attendance by thanking Bishop O'Connell, and acknowledging the dedication of Sister



Lillian Harrington, who served the Villa community for more than 40 years as teacher, principal and president, and Sister Lesley Draper, who has diligently served as principal since 2010. "An anniversary celebration of nine decades can only begin with profound gratitude to almighty God," Sister Patricia stated. She continued by reflecting on the sisters who traveled to the United States and were tasked with beginning the school al-

most a century ago.




### Queen of Peace Region – India Celebration of All Saints Day

"First, Nurture your vocation daily through your prayer life. Eucharist and Scripture should be the center of our life. Secondly, live your vows faithfully.
